


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
Imaret

Kavala

With its apricot-hued domes, stunning harbor views, plush furnishings and discreet service, the Imaret is fit for a sultan. Built between 1817 and 1821 by the founder of the modern Egyptian state Mohamed Ali, as a gift to his northeastern Greek birthplace Kavala, it operated as a seminary and later housed Greek refugees. In 2004 it was fully restored, retaining its Greek, Roman, Byzantine and Arabic influences, and thanks to hotel proprietor Anna Missirian, guests can enjoy the privilege of staying there. Each of its thirty rooms, including four suites, is unique: some have octagonal baths and fireplaces, others sea or garden views. The Eastern flavor is enhanced by the décor-oriental rugs, silk pillows, chandeliers, patterned lighting, urns, and little bowls of dried fruit. Gourmet Mediterranean dishes, created with produce from the hotel's own garden, can be savored poolside. Surrender to an aromatherapy massage, try the hamam, then slip into the divine indoor pool.
